TESTING

All HHS students will be taking ACT standardized exams during the school day on Tuesday, April 23rd. This is a school-wide testing day where students will begin at 7:45 and be released to go home at 1:00 p.m. See below for more information and tips:

- Juniors and seniors will be taking the ACT college entrance exam, with writing.
- Freshman and sophomores will be taking the ACT Plan.
- Students should report directly to their testing rooms the morning of the test.
- Room assignments are posted outside of Guidance and in the Great Hall.
- Everybody should get a good night's sleep and eat breakfast.

• Bring a calculator! Calculators will not be provided and are needed for the test. Cell phones or iPods are not allowed to be used as a calculator.

- Bring a couple of #2 pencils. Mechanical pencils will not be allowed.
- Food and drinks will not be allowed in the testing room.

Leave cell phones / electronic devices at home or in lockers during the exam. These devices will not be allowed in testing rooms.

It is imperative for students to take these exams seriously and try their absolute best. This is a stepping stone to preparing for the future and ensure all students are COLLEGE AND CAREER READY!


Five seniors competed in the Calumet Regional Science Fair and came away with numerous awards including state qualifications. Michael Bachmann received the Surgeon's General award and a Bronze Director's award for his project on the effectiveness of higher SPF sunscreen.

Jasmine Suarez and Aimee Pope received the Hosak award for project excellence, U.S. Army Certificate of Achievement, Bronze Director's Award and qualified to go down for the SEFI State Science Fair. Their project focused on acceleration and softball.

Madeline Jewell also received a Bronze Director's Award and U.S. Army Award package, U.S. Air Force Award, and 4th place for the St. Anthony sponsored ranking. She also placed 4th in the Senior Division and has qualified to go down to state. Her project focused on the hygiene of blade dryers.

State qualification and the Saint Anthony award also came with a monetary award of \$25.00.

This was our first showing at the regional fair, and HHS students were very impressive. It was certainly a learning experience for all.
