



PBIS

Positive Behavior Intervention and Support

PBIS is a *Positive Behavior Intervention and Support Program* that promotes positive behavior in a school where all participants are encouraged daily to make positive choices. The school-wide system includes proactive strategies for defining, teaching, and supporting appropriate student behaviors. This system organizes adults and students to create a school culture that will encourage positive behavior and interactions while discouraging problem behaviors. This culture will lead to a safer environment where students achieve academically and build positive relationships with peers and adults.


