### Hobart Band Wins Praise Of Fans At Northwest'rn Game

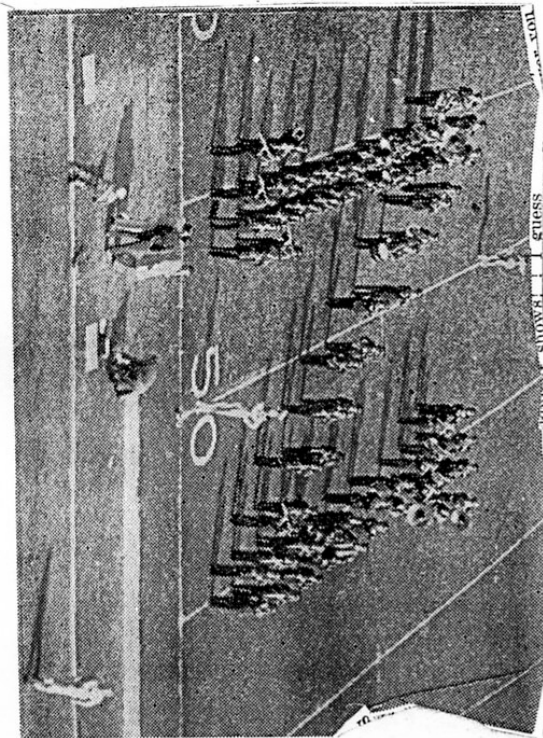
