

In an effort for Hobart High School to continue to prepare our students for a college or career, ACT will continue to be a main focus of the 2012-2013 academic school year. Our goal for using ACT is to motivate students to perform to their best ability and increase college enrollment. The test scores reflect what students have learned while here at HHS. The ACT assesses a students' capability to complete college-level work. Colleges and universities use those scores to recruit, advise, and help students obtain a quality education.

The ACT assessment is divided into four multiple choice subject tests: English, mathematics, reading, and science reasoning. The four main sections of the ACT are scored from 1-36. A composite score is given using the average of all four scores. At Hobart High School, ACT is one tool we use to determine the college readiness of our students.



Time Out for Reading will take place Friday, October 5th at 10 a.m. Students, teachers, administrators, parents, business leaders, and organizations are invited to be caught with "Their Nose in a Book". We all can do our part to show the importance of reading.



This year is also the 6th annual Books to Bridge the Region. The 2012 theme is, "Where in the World are you from. The goal of Books to Bridge the Region is to promote literacy, to create conversations among communities, and to foster critical thinking related to a topic. **COMCOSt** Comcast introduced a program to bring the Internet to more students and families across the country. Comcast is offering Internet service to Hobart families that qualify for only \$9.95 a month plus tax. While participating in the Internet Essentials program,

you never have any price increase, pay activation, or equipment rental fee. You also get free Internet training and can buy a computer at initial enrollment for the low price of \$149.99 plus tax. To qualify your household must meet the following criteria:

- Have at least one child receiving free or reduced price school lunches through the National School Lunch Program
- Have not subscribed to Comcast Internet service within the last 90 days
- Not have an overdue Comcast bill or unreturned equipment
