

# September 11th 2012



On September 11th, 2001 the World Trade Centers and the Pentagon were attacked by hijacked airplanes. These acts of terrorism shook the nation, but also united us as a country. Now, eleven years later, we look back on the events that unfolded that day and the years that followed, remembering all those who were lost.

On September 11, 2012 Hobart held a

remembrance ceremony at Festival Park. Attendees included current and retired service members, first responders, Hobart High School JROTC, and patriotic civilians to honor 9/11 and those who were lost. The remembrance ceremony included the playing of Taps,

speeches from local politicians and civil officials, a tribute to all the people affected by 9/11, and they finished off the ceremony with the releasing of balloons for those affected by this tragedy. It was a very moving event. Nearly 100 JROTC Cadets showed up and handed out flags and balloons to every city member who attended. Hundreds of flags were handed out, and it was a night we surely won't forget.
